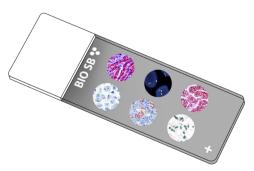

# Maspin Control Slides





## **Intended Use**

For In Vitro Diagnostic Use.

#### **Summary and Explanation**

Maspin (mammary serine protease inhibitor) is a protein that in humans is encoded by the SERPINB5 gene. This protein belongs to the serpin (serine protease inhibitor) superfamily. SERPINB5 was originally reported to function as a tumor suppressor gene in epithelial cells, suppressing the ability of cancer cells to invade and metastasize to other tissues.

Maspin has been shown in primary breast cancer to be regulated by wild-type p53, defining a new category of molecular targets of p53 that have the potential to negatively regulate tumor invasion and metastasis. Loss of Maspin expression correlates with increased tumor aggressiveness and poor prognosis in advanced breast and prostate cancer. In contrast, Maspin has been shown to be overexpressed in pancreatic, ovarian, thyroid, gastric, lung, bladder, breast, skin and colon cancer. Several studies have investigated the prognostic significance of Maspin expression in lung cancer. In primary non-small cell lung cancer was an independent negative prognostic factor for overall survival, whereas strong nuclear Maspin expression was associated with increased overall and disease-free survival in patients with resectable NSCLC.

## Stability

This product is stable up to the expiration date on the product label. Do not use after expiration date listed on package label.

#### IHC Protocol

- 1. Subject tissues to heat induced epitope retrieval (HIER) using a suitable retrieval solution such as ImmunoDNA Retriever with Citrate (BSB 0020-BSB 0023) or EDTA (BSB 0030-BSB 0033).
- 2. Any of three heating methods may be used:

## a. TintoRetriever Pressure Cooker or Equivalent

Place tissues/slides in a staining dish or coplin jar containing the ImmunoDNA Retriever with Citrate or EDTA and place on trivet in the pressure cooker. Add 1-2 inches of distilled water to the pressure cooker and turn heat to high. Incubate for 15 minutes. Open and immediately transfer slides to room temperature.

## b. TintoRetriever PT Module or Water Bath Method

Place tissues/slides in a pre-warmed staining dish or coplin jar containing the ImmunoDNA Retriever with Citrate or EDTA at 95°-99° C. Incubate for 30-60 minutes.

## c. Conventional Steamer Method

Place tissues/slides in a pre-warmed staining dish or coplin jar containing the ImmunoDNA Retriever with Citrate or EDTA in a steamer, cover and steam for 30-60 minutes.

- 3. After heat treatment, transfer slides in ImmunoDNA Retriever with Citrate or EDTA to room temperature and let stand for 15-20 minutes.
- 4. For manual staining, perform antibody incubation at ambient temperature. For automated staining methods, perform antibody incubation according to instrument manufacturer's instructions.
- 5. Wash slides with ImmunoDNA washer or DI water.
- 6. Continue IHC staining protocol. Wash slides between each step with ImmunoDNA washer solution.

#### Abbreviated IF Protocol

Step	Incubation Time			
Rinse slides in IF wash buffer	5 minutes			
Drain and wipe excess IF wash buffer off slide				
Conduct remaining steps in the dark				
Apply Antibody	30-60 minutes			
Rinse with 3 changes of IF wash buffer	3x15 minutes each			
Coverslip with IF mounting medium				

## **Mounting Protocols**

For detailed instructions using biodegradable permanent mounting media such as XyGreen PermaMounter (BSB 0169-0174) or organic solvent based resin such as PermaMounter (BSB 0094-0097), refer to PI0174 or PI0097.

#### **Product Limitations**

Due to inherent variability present in immunohistochemical procedures (including fixation time of tissues, dilution factor of antibody, retrieval method utilized, and incubation time), optimal performance should be established through the use of positive and negative controls. Results should be interpreted by a qualified medical professional.
